In my short message of thanks, let me briefly mention three ethical topics of concern, in the perspective of my field of ethics and working on global level on all continents through the global network Globethics.net, where I am Founder and President (www.globethics.net).

## 1. Globalance

The world is moving from a globalized to a new polarized world, from the old Cold War (many of us experienced it!) to a new Cold War, as the conflict USA-China shows daily. We are more and more forced to decide if we are for West or East. IT Technologies are in the midst of it. Do you have an Apple, Samsung or Huawei mobile phone is no more a simple technical, but a highly political question. Extremist and fundamentalist trends need a strong ethical answer. We need to balance opposite values such as freedom and justice, security and openness, innovation and

conservation. We can overcome threats such as the Covid, climate warming, terrorism and autocratic governments not by division and polarization, but only by balanced values and cooperation.

## 2. Cyber Ethics

The digital and virtual technologies are a key driver in all sectors of society. UNIBIT can substantially contribute to a values-driven development and use of digital technologies, from internet to surveillance, from drones to satellites, from artificial itelligence to metaversum, from cyber-security to online education.

## 3. Values-driven Leadership

We celebrate here in Bulgaria today the Day of national Revival Leaders of Bulgaria. Leadership is key in every generation and every sector of society, be it the family, the academic, business, religious, cultural and especially political sector. Leaders in all sectors are often money-driven or power-driven. Money and power are important to implement goals, but the core motivation and orientation of leaders should be values and virtues.
